What are your rights?

- Everyone has the right to feel safe and protected.
- No one is allowed to threaten you, hurt you or touch you in a way that makes you feel uncomfortable
- No one should behave in a way that makes you feel unsafe or afraid, including anyone in your family, in your school or anywhere else in the community

How do I know if something is wrong

- Every relationship should be respectful
- It is wrong for anyone to hurt you or make you feel unsafe, uncomfortable or afraid.
- Remember aperson doesn't have to physically hurt or touch you to be doing the wrong thing.
- Even if you are not sure, if something doesn't feel right you should tell an adult who can help you.
